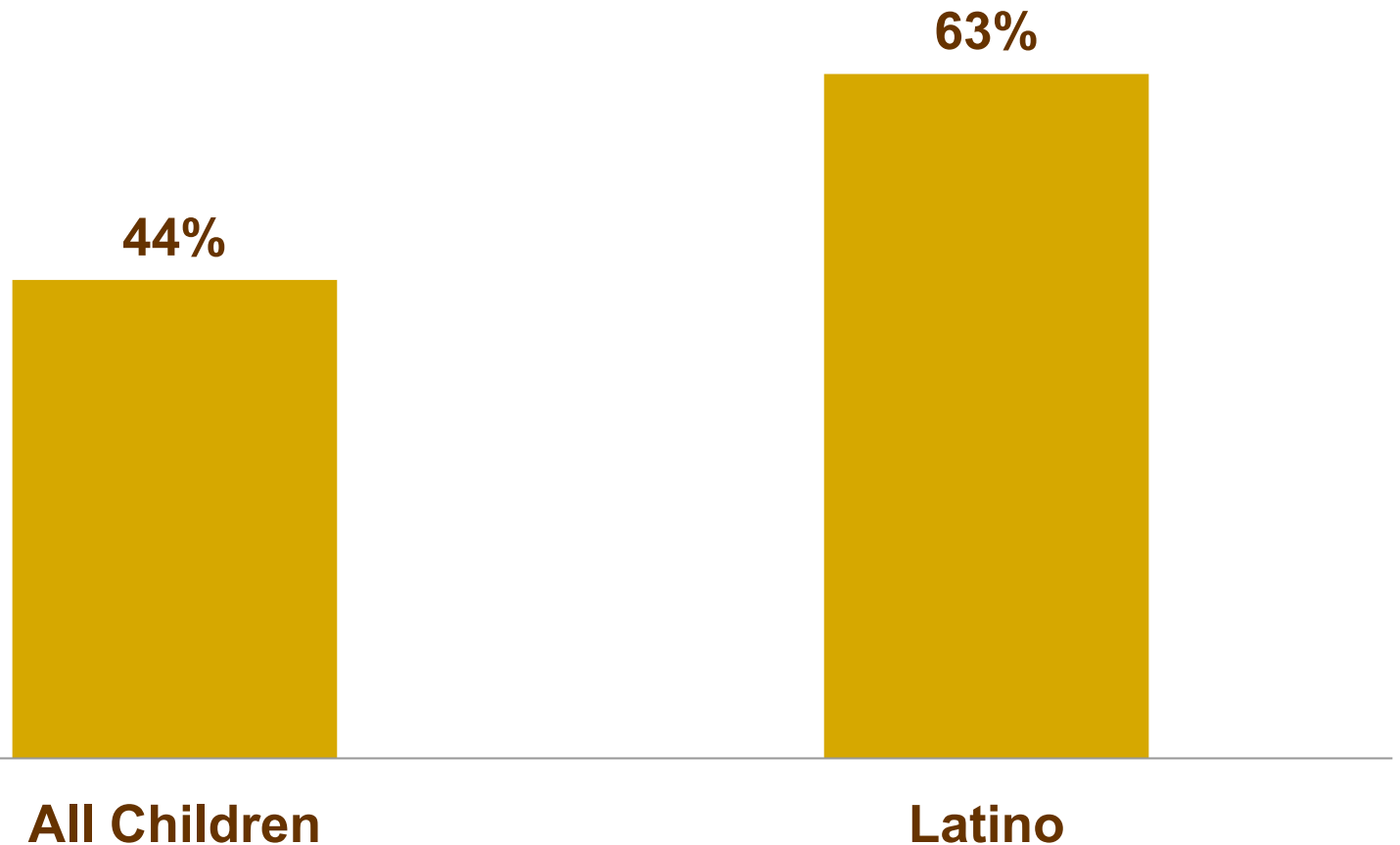




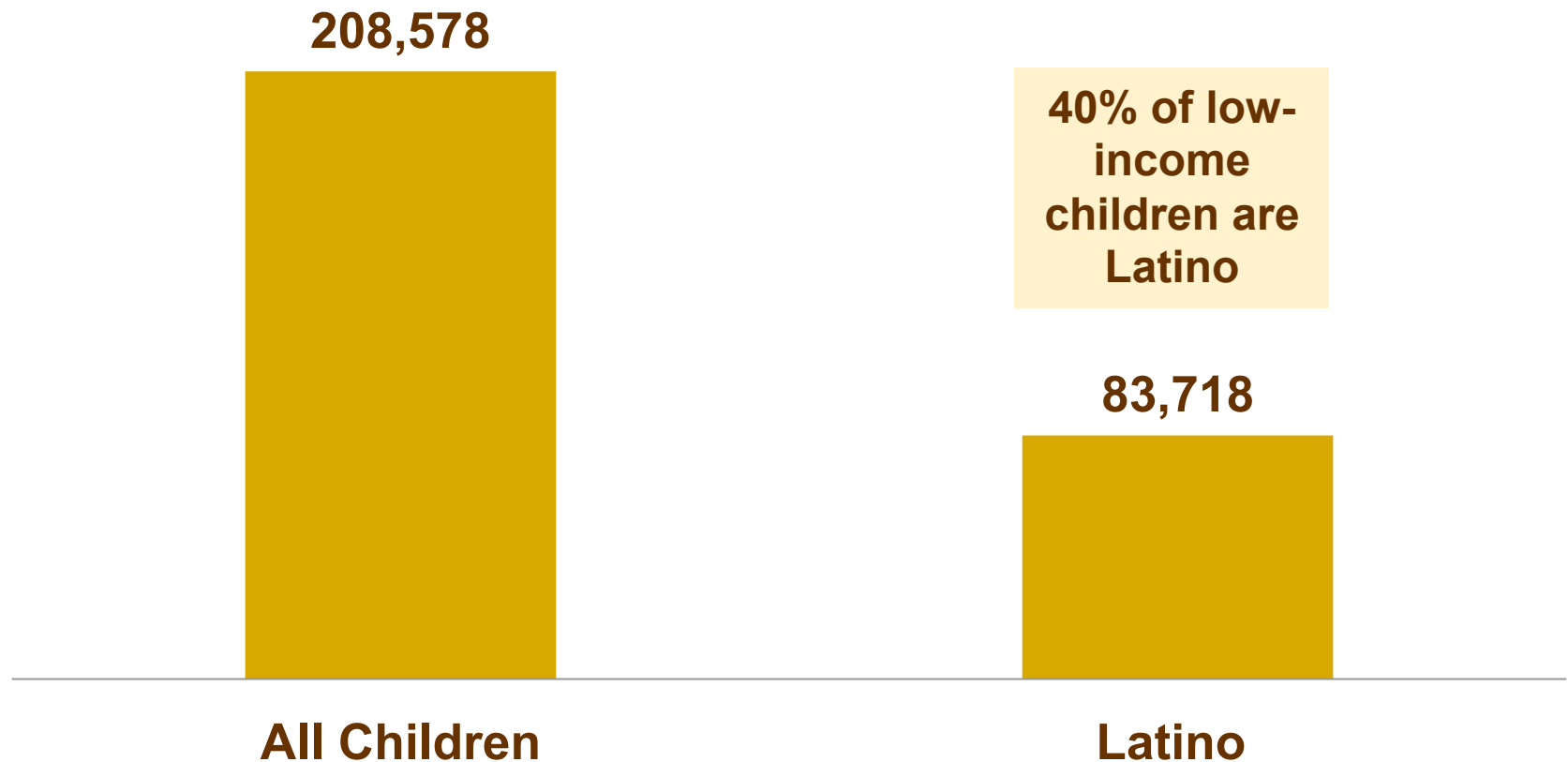
Low-Income and Birth to Three Population

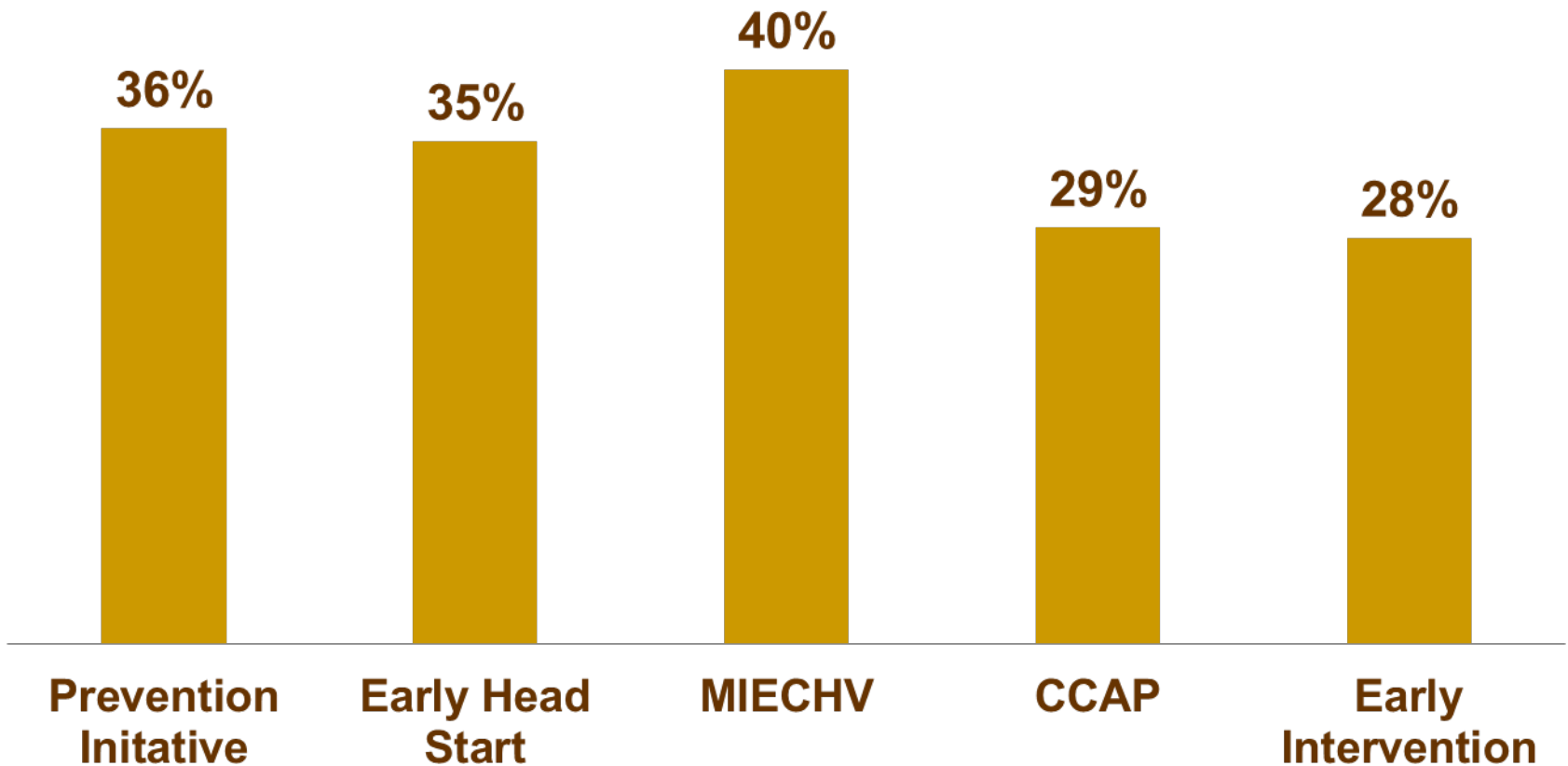


Low-Income Children Birth to Three

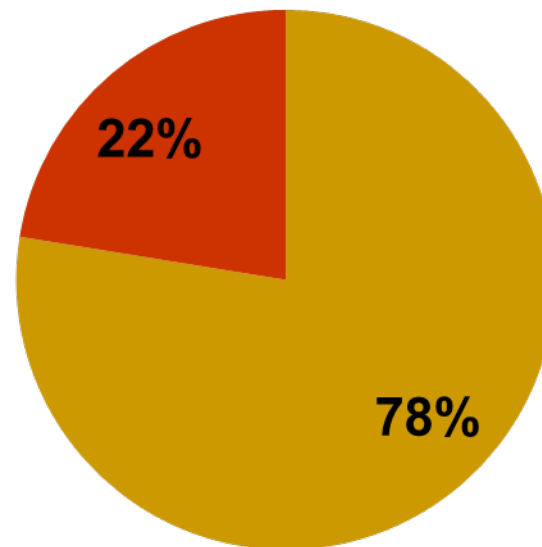
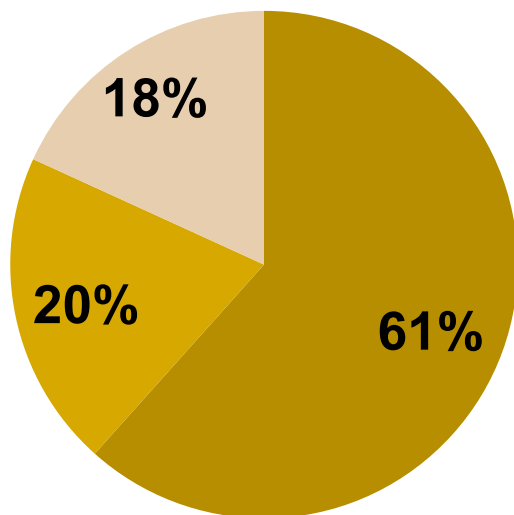

■ White ■ Latino ■ African American

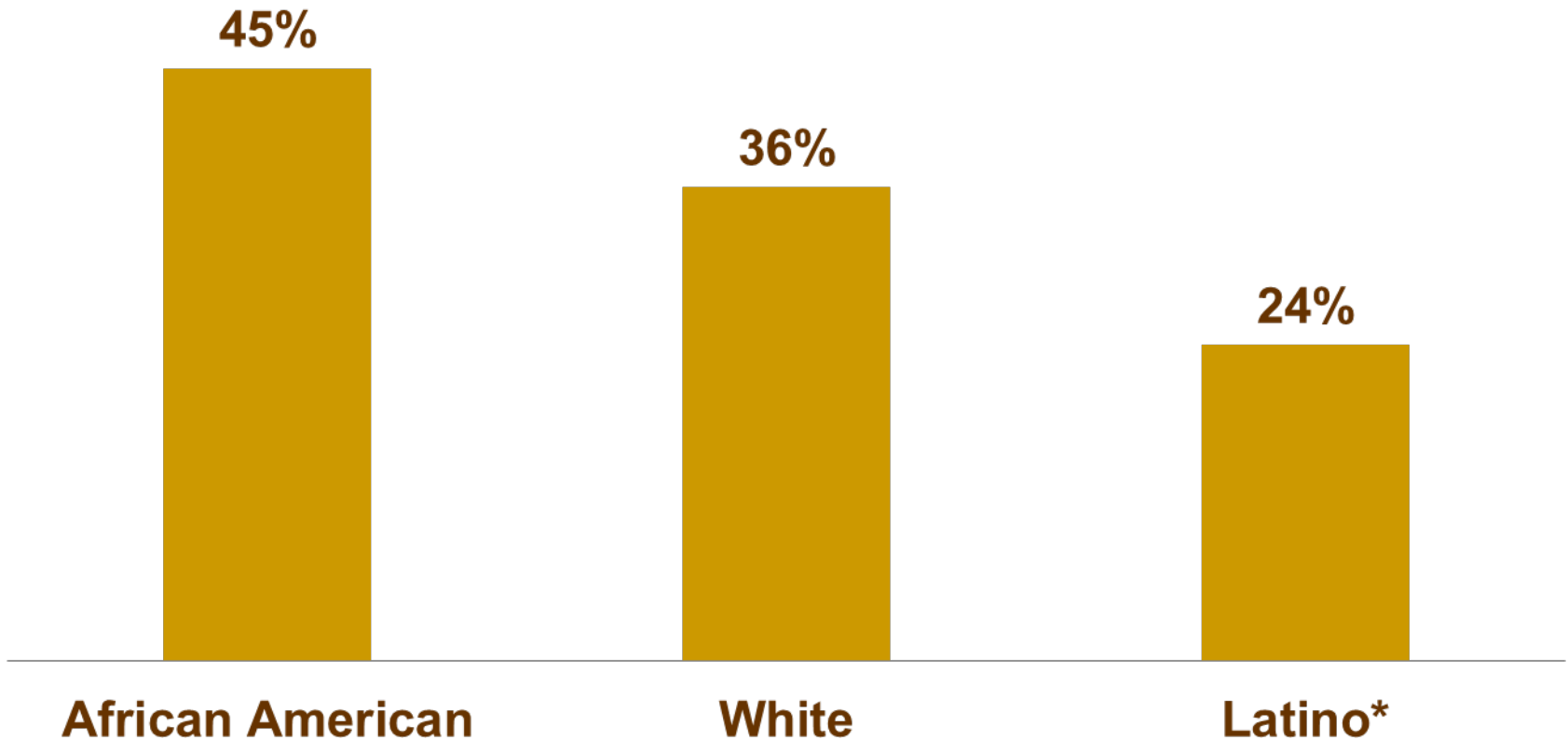
